## Kiss & Ride

Police and Council's Compliance staff will be monitoring schools and when driving or parking infringements are observed, fines may be issued.

- Remain within your vehicle at all times.
- Support younger students by teaching them to buckle their seatbelts independently.
- Place bags within the vehicle rather than the boot to minimise risk to our students.
- Arrive at your child/ren's allocated afternoon dismissal time.
- If the Kiss and Ride Zone is full with vehicles, please continue to drive on around the block and re-enter at the end of the queue when the zone is clear. DO NOT BLOCK THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC.
- Stay in Sequence. Please queue in an orderly manner.
- U Turns in our Kiss and Ride zone are illegal, dangerous and puts our children at risk.
