

# Year 3 Learning Overview

Term 3, 2022

Welcome to Term 3. We look forward to a great term of learning.



This term in Religious Education we will be inquiring into how we can care for God's wondrous creation. In addition, we will be learning about the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



We will continue our Literacy learning through the elements of our Literacy block, which are:

- Guided Reading groups
- Shared reading
- Independent reading
- Read aloud

- Modelled writing
- Guided writing
- Independent writing

Our writing this term will focus on writing persuasive, informative and imaginative texts including the different features:

- Structure
- Sophisticated language
- Audience
- Conventions of writing (spelling, punctuation and grammar)

We will read *Charlotte's Web* by E.B.White as a class this term and encourage all students to read a variety of novels both at home and school.



This term we will continue exploring mathematical concepts through open-ended investigations and rich tasks.

We will be learning:

- Fractions and Decimals
- Addition and Subtraction
- Length
- Multiplication and Division

- Mass
- Angles & 2D Space
- Chance & Data
- Patterns & Algebra



This term students in Year 3 will be focusing on Project-Based learning. PBL is a dynamic classroom approach in which students actively explore real-world problems and challenges, acquire deeper knowledge and transfer their learning.

During this term our Science focus is based around Solids, Liquids and Gases. Students will be able to conduct experiments involving the three states of matter.

To begin our Science unit the students will be participating in an incursion that focuses on the three states of matter. Students will continue to work in the garden through planting and harvesting our vegetables.

In Coding lessons with Mrs Lark, students will be presenting their Ozobot Story Maps on Seesaw and evaluating their coding skills. They will also learn more features they can use in the Sora eLibrary app, and begin exploring Google Earth. Students will also learn how to access and use an online journal to track their learning on Google Classroom, as well as skills such as selected screenshots.



### CREATIVE ARTS

In **Dance**, students will focus on developing knowledge, skills, values and attitudes in performing, composing and appreciating the elements of dance through a range of contexts. This unit will provide a sequence of learning experiences based upon the theme of seasons.

In **Music**, students are continuing to develop their music notation skills by playing the recorder. They will be introduced to a new piece of music to play this term. When they master this, a more difficult piece will be introduced which requires them to develop different fingering skills and to be able to read more complicated notation. In order to develop listening skills, we will focus on the Folk Music genre.



This term our Personal Development and Health unit is about Protective Behaviours. Child protection education aims to assist students to develop skills in:

- recognising and responding to unsafe situations
- seeking assistance effectively
- establishing and maintaining positive relationships and strengthening attitudes and values related to equality, respect and responsibility.

In Term 3, students will participate in Dance Fever, an external school provider for gymnastics and fundamental movement lessons each Friday. Dance Fever instructors will teach the students a variety of gymnastics skills that involve strength, balance, and coordination. The program will also teach the students social skills such as self expression, respect for others, etiquette, school spirit, teamwork and sportsmanship through exercise and enjoyment.
